Health Decision Science (1606)

Students are expected to be familiar with Excel, and be capable of carrying out basic functions using Excel software, particularly drawing box and arrow diagrams, inserting formulae into cells, producing simple charts and tables. Students should also be reasonably numerate and feel confident in basic mathematics and simple logic.

Students who have previously registered for or completed DL module PHM201 may not select this option.

Studying at the School

Immigration/Visas: Non-UK nationals who would like to attend on-campus modules at the School may require a student visa to allow them to study in the UK. If your DL fees are paid by a sponsor, you may need to check that they approve you studying module(s) at the School rather than by distance learning.

Cost

Distance learning students who wish to study a short course (module) at LSHTM will be required to pay a fee for the LSHTM module(s). This fee is in addition to your DL programme fee. The module fee will vary depending on whether you have already paid for your distance learning MSc by one initial payment to the University of London or you are paying individually for distance learning modules on an annual basis. The cost will be £1,060 per module if you have paid for your DL programme by one initial payment at the point of initial proligation regliatation regliatation polycation payment at the point of initial proligation regliatation. Do not send any payment at this stage - confirmation of the cost of your LSHTM module(s) and how to pay will be included in your offer of admission which will be sent to you if your application for blended learning study is successful.

If you are registering through the University of London for the distance learning modules you wish to study next year, please do NOT register or include any payment for LSHTM on-campus modules you are choosing to study by blended learning. Transfer of module payments from the University of London to the LSHTM cannot be made. Please see below How to apply.
